

August 23 --- Planners, Tribe Expectations and Getting to Know You

Objective:

Students will understand what the expectations are for them in maintaining their planners.

Materials:

- Student Planners
- Pen / Pencil
- Letter to Students and Parents
- Scavenger Hunt for Handbook and Planner

Introduction:

Tell students that this year we want to help them be better organized. Filling out their planner will be part of their Tribe Time grade. Once a month they will get points for making sure that they have their planners filled out. If they have no homework, they need to write that down in their planner.

Activities:

- Introduce yourself to your tribe.
- Explain that Tribe Time is a pass-fail class. If they fill out their planners and come to Tribe Time and participate they will pass. Five points will be awarded each Thursday, then there will be four points awarded each week for making sure their planners are filled out, this will be put in as a separate assignment. If planners are lost it will be \$5.00 to replace them.
- Handout planners, scavenger hunt and letter to parents / guardians. The scavenger hunt can be filled out as a class, groups or individually.
- Once planners and the format of Tribe Time has been covered, get to know your tribe. Play any icebreaker games / activities that you like.
 - **Fact or Fiction aka Two Truths and a Lie:** have everyone in the tribe come up two facts about themselves and one fictional thing. Each person will introduce themselves and tell their three things. Then the class will try and decide which one is fictional.
 - **Would You Rather:** Here is a link to one version of this game. <https://www.funwithmama.com/would-you-rather-questions/>. These can either be printed onto small cards or strips of paper or just read off to the students.
 - **Get to Know you Ball:** Use any plastic ball and write get to know you questions on it.
